Sub:- JNTUH, Hyderabad – Academic & Planning – Implementation of resolution of the Standing Committee of the Academic Senate for partial modifications for R13 Academic Regulations of UG and PG programmes from the Academic Year 2015-16 - Orders – Issued.

Read: 1. Resolution approved under item No.02 in the XIX Meeting of the Standing Committee of the Academic Senate-held on 09.03.2015.
2. Note orders of the Vice-Chancellor dated 11.03.2015.

ORDER:

Based on the recommendations of the XVIII meeting of the Standing Committee of the Academic Senate held on 23.02.2015, a Committee was constituted to examine the present R13 Academic Regulations and Promotion policy with regard to UG and PG programs of the JNTUH.

The Committee met on 05.03.2015 @ 03.00 pm in the Conference Hall of the Academic & Planning Section and submitted its reports.

The matter was placed before the XIX Meeting of the Standing Committee of the Academic Senate which discussed thoroughly the recommendations of the Committee constituted by the University and resolved the following partial modifications under R-13 Academic Regulations of UG and PG programmes:

For award of B. Tech. degree (Regular) under Point No.1.3:

- For award of B.Tech. degree (Regular), the candidate shall register for 224 credits and secure 216 credits. The student can avail exemption of two subjects upto 8 credits, that is, one open elective and one elective subject or two elective subjects under regular stream, with compulsory subjects listed in the Table – 1 remaining unchanged.

For award of B. Tech. (Lateral Entry Scheme) under Point No.2:

- For award of B.Tech. degree (Lateral Entry), the candidate shall register for 168 credits and secure 160 credits from II to IV year. The student can avail exemption of two

subjects upto 8 credits, that is, one open elective and one elective subject or two elective subjects under lateral entry scheme, with compulsory subjects listed in the Table – 1 remaining unchanged.

Minimum Academic Requirements under Point No. 7.2 to 7.4 are changed as follows for B.Tech (Regular):

- 7.2 A student will not be promoted from I Year to II Year unless he fulfills the academic requirement of 28 credits out of 56 credits of I year from all the examinations and secures prescribed minimum attendance in I year.
- 7.3 A student will not be promoted from II year to III year unless he fulfills the academic requirement of 50 credits out of 84 credits up to II year I semester or 68 credits out of 112 credits upto II year II Semester, from all the examinations, whether or not the candidate takes the examinations and secures prescribed minimum attendance in II year II semester.
- 7.4 A student shall be promoted from III year to IV year only if he fulfills the academic requirements of 84 credits out of 140 credits up to III year I semester or 100 credits out of 168 credits upto III Year II Semester from all the examinations, whether or not the candidate takes the examinations and secures prescribed minimum attendance in III year II semester.

Promotion Rule under Point No. 5 is changed as follows for B.Tech (Lateral Entry Scheme):

- 5.1 A student will not be promoted from II year to III year unless he fulfills the academic requirement of 17 credits out of 28 credits in II year I semester or 34 credits out of 56 credits upto II year II Semester, from all the examinations, whether or not the candidate takes the examinations and secures prescribed minimum attendance in II year II semester.
- 5.2 A student shall be promoted from III year to IV year only if he fulfills the academic requirements of 50 credits out of 84 credits up to III year I semester or 68 credits out of 112 credits upto III Year II Semester from all the examinations, whether or not the candidate takes the examinations and secures prescribed minimum attendance in III year II semester.

Minimum Academic Requirements under Point No. 6.2 and 6.3 is changed as follows for B. Pharmacy (Regular):

- 6.2 A student will not be promoted from I Year to II Year unless he fulfills the academic requirement of 28 credits out of 56 credits of I year from all the examinations and secures prescribed minimum attendance in I year.
- 6.3 A student will not be promoted from II year to III year unless he fulfills the academic requirement of 50 credits out of 84 credits up to II year I semester or 68 credits out of 112 credits upto II year II Semester, from all the examinations, whether or not the candidate takes the examinations and secures prescribed minimum attendance in II year II semester.
A student shall be promoted from III year to IV year only if he fulfills the academic requirements of 84 credits out of 140 credits up to III year I semester or 100 credits out of 168 credits upto III Year II Semester from all the examinations, whether or not the candidate takes the examinations and secures prescribed minimum attendance in III year II semester.

Promotion Rule under Point No. 5 is changed as follows for B.Pharmacy (Lateral Entry Scheme):

- 5.1 A student will not be promoted from II year to III year unless he fulfills the academic requirement of 17 credits out of 28 credits in II year I semester or 34 credits out of 56 credits upto II year II Semester, from all the examinations, whether or not the candidate takes the examinations and secures prescribed minimum attendance in II year II semester.
- 5.2 A student shall be promoted from III year to IV year only if he fulfills the academic requirements of 50 credits out of 84 credits up to III year I semester or 68 credits out of 112 credits upto III Year II Semester from all the examinations, whether or not the candidate takes the examinations and secures prescribed minimum attendance in III year II semester.


For M. Tech., M. Pharmacy, MBA and MCA Programme are changed as follows:

For M. Tech. programme under Point No. 5.1 & 5.2	<p>For the theory subjects 75 marks shall be awarded for the performance in the End Semester Examination and 25 marks shall be awarded for Internal Evaluation. The internal evaluation shall be made based on the average of the marks secured in the two Mid Term-Examinations conducted, one in the middle of the Semester and the other, immediately after the completion of instruction. Each mid-term examination shall be conducted for a total duration of 120 minutes with Part A as compulsory question (10 marks) consisting of 5 sub-questions carrying 2 marks each, and Part B with 3 questions to be answered out of 5 questions, each question carrying 5 marks. The details of the Question Paper pattern for End Examination (Theory) are given below:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The End Semester Examination will be conducted for 75 marks. It consists of two parts. i).Part-A for 25 marks, ii). Part-B for 50 marks. • Part-A is a compulsory question consisting of 5 questions, one from each unit and carries 5 marks each. This will be treated as Question 1. • Part-B consists of 5 Questions (numbered from 2 to 6) carrying 10 marks each. Each of these questions is from one unit and may contain sub-questions. For each question there will be an either/or choice (that means there will be two questions from each unit and the student should answer only one question) <p>For practical subjects, 75 marks shall be awarded for performance in the End Semester Examinations and 25 marks shall be awarded for day-to-day performance as Internal Marks.</p>
For M. Pharmacy Programme under Point No. 5.1 & 5.2	
For MBA. programme under Point No. 4.1 & 4.2	
For MCA Programme under Point No. 4.1 & 4.2	
For M. Tech. programme under Point No. 5.8	<p>For conducting laboratory end examinations of all PG Programmes, one internal examiner and one external examiner are to be appointed. The external examiner will be appointed by the Director of Evaluation, JNTUH. The external examiner should be selected from outside the College concerned but</p>
For M. Pharmacy programme under Point No. 5.8	
For MBA. programme under	

Point No. 4.7	within the cluster. No external examiner should be appointed from any other College in the same cluster/any other cluster which is run by the same Management.
For MCA Programme under Point No. 4.8	

The above modifications come into force with effect from the academic year 2015-16.
