At the outset, the Principal and Chairman of Academic Council, Prof. G. ChandraMohan Reddy has welcomed all the members of the Academic Council and the Principal gave a brief presentation on the purpose for calling for an emergency academic council meeting. Further, the Principal requested all the members to actively participate, express their views and approve the items listed on the agenda.

#### Agenda Item No.1:

To Confirm the Minutes of the 4<sup>th</sup>Meeting of the Academic Council held on 11<sup>th</sup> October 2023.

Minutes: Prof. G. ChandraMohan Reddy, the Principal and Chairman of the Academic Council informed that the minutes were circulated to all the members and briefly presented the minutes of

the 4<sup>th</sup> meeting of Academic Council (AC) held on 11<sup>th</sup> October 2023 to the esteemed members and the same were confirmed by the members.

#### Agenda Item No.2:

To confirm the implementation of the decisions which were taken in 4<sup>th</sup>Meeting of the Academic Council held on 11<sup>th</sup> October 2023.

Minutes: The Chair informed that the institution implemented the following important decisions which were taken in 4<sup>th</sup>Meeting of the academic council held on 11<sup>th</sup> October, 2023:

• Almanac of B.Tech I to IV Semester and M.Tech I to IV Semesters for the Academic year 2023-24 for MR-21 and MR-22 regulations.

• Constitution, roles and responsibilities of Examinations and Results Committee.

Further, the Chair presented that the above mentioned were adopted in MGIT in accordance with the decisions taken in the 4<sup>th</sup>Academic council meeting held on 11<sup>th</sup> October, 2023.

After brief discussion, the Principal submitted it for approval and the same was confirmed by the members.

#### Agenda Item No.3:

# Approval for relaxing of promotion rules of MR21 & MR22 Regulations and subject Re-registration in MR-22 regulations.

**Minutes**: The Principal presented the relaxation of the promotion rules with respect to R18 & R22 Regulations of JNTUH and their subsequent adoption and implementation in MGIT Autonomous MR-21 and MR-22 Regulations, as per the Order vide proceedings No A1/16/2023 dated 15.12.2023 issued by the Registrar, JNTUH (as per Annexure-1), and informed JNTUH University's decision to relax promotion rules for B.Tech regular and lateral entry students of R18 Regulations and B.Tech regular and lateral entry students of R22 Regulations. Further, JNTUH has advised all the autonomous institutions to adopt the same in their respective colleges of their regulations.

Principal presented that the relaxation of promotion rules will be adopted in MGIT in line with the JNTUH for B.Tech regular and lateral entry students of MR-21 Regulations and for B.Tech regular and lateral entry students of MR-22 Regulations respectively.

(a) While presenting the original condition to be fulfilled of the MR-21 Regulations, the Principal mentioned the following:

For promotion from B.Tech (MR-21 Regulations) IV Semester to V Semester, the Regular student has to secure at least 47 credits out of 79 credits i.e. 60% of total credits up to IV semester from all the relevant Regular and Supplementary examinations and the Lateral entry student has to secure at least 25 credits out of 42 credits i.e. 60 percentage of total credits from III and IV semester from all the relevant regular and supplementary examinations.

While elaborating on the new condition to be fulfilled, the Chair referred to the proceedings vide number A1/16/2023 dated 15.12.2023 issued by the Registrar, JNTUH and mentioned the following:

For promotion from B.Tech (MR-21 Regulations) IV Semester to V Semester, the Regular student has to secure at least 20 credits out of 79 credits i.e. 25% of total credits up to IV semester from all the relevant Regular and Supplementary examinations and the Lateral entry student has to secure at least 11 credits out of 42 credits i.e. 25% of total credits from III and IV semester from all the relevant Regular and Supplementary examinations.

Based on the above relaxed promotion rules, the following students have been detained due to lack of required credits from IV Semester to V Semester for the Academic year 2023-24.

(b) While presenting the original condition to be fulfilled of the MR-22 Regulations, the Principal mentioned the following:

For promotion from B.Tech (MR-22 Regulations) II semester to III semester, the Regular student has to secure at least 20 credits out of 40 credits i.e. 50 percentage of total credits up to II Semester from all the relevant Regular and Supplementary examinations.

While elaborating on the new condition to be fulfilled, he referred to the vide proceedings number A1/16/2023 dated 15.12.2023 issued by the Registrar, JNTUH and mentioned the following:

For promotion from B.Tech MR-22 Regulations II Semester to III Semester the Regular student has to secure at least 10 credits out of 40 credits i.e. 25% of total credits up to II Semester from all the Regular and Supplementary examinations.

Based on the above relaxed promotion rules, the following students have been detained due to lack of required credits from II Semester to III Semester for the Academic year 2023-24.

Later, the Principal referred to the Notification of JNTUH (Procs No A1/16/2023) i.e. Annexure-1 and added that based on the recommendation of the academic council, the same will be ratified by the Governing body.

Then, Dr. S. Durga Bhavani, Professor, School of Computer Science, University of Hyderabad expressed her concern about the burden of the number of credits that students are supposed to fulfill. While responding to it, the Principal mentioned that the respective departments are conducting remedial and special classes subject-wise for the students in III and V Semesters to help students to clear their backlogs.

Principal also informed the members that JNTUH in the Revised R-22 regulations dated 26.10.2023 has relaxed the re-reregistration norms as mentioned below.

A student can re-register for subjects in a semester:

If the internal marks secured by a student in the Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) marks for 40 (Sum of average of two mid-term examinations consisting of Objective & descriptive parts, Average of two Assignments & Subject Viva-voce/PPT/ Poster presentation/ Case Study on a topic in the concerned subject) are less than 35% and failed in those subjects.

They may seek re-registration for all those subjects registered in that semester in which the student is failed. The student has to re-appear for CIE and SEE as and when offered. A student must re-register for the failed subject(s) for 40 marks within four weeks of commencement of the classwork in next academic year. His/Her CIE marks for 40 obtained in the previous attempt stand cancelled. The student has to obtain fresh set of marks for 40 allotted for CIE (Sum of average of two midterm examinations consisting of objective, descriptive parts & assignment and Continuous Evaluation of Subject Viva-voce/PPT/ Poster presentation/ Case Study on a topic in the concerned subject). Head of the Dept. will conduct the Internal Evaluation of such students.

After brief discussion, the Principal submitted for the approval and the same was confirmed by the members.

## Agenda 1: Enhancement of Student Examination fee structure for B.Tech and M.Tech and Examination Remuneration:

**Minutes:** The Principal presented the Enhancement of Student Examination fee structure for B.Tech and M.Tech and Examination Remuneration. The Principal requested the academic council members for the approval of revised examination fee structure and remuneration. The present examination fee structure and remuneration was approved by the AC during the A.Y. 2021-22. In the due course of time, it was found that it would be difficult to meet expenditure with the existing fee structure in the autonomous model. Subsequently, the Director, AES and the CoE enquired examination fee structure and remuneration in various autonomous colleges. Based on the enquiry, MGIT proposes to enhance the fee as per enclosed Annexure-2.

After presenting it, the Principal submitted for the approval and the same was confirmed by the members.

It is informed that the Institute is accredited by NAAC in 2nd Cycle with  $A^{++}$  grade for Five Years from 23<sup>rd</sup> Nov 2023.

At the end of the meeting, the Principal and Chairman of the Academic Council, Prof. G. Chandra Mohan Reddy, Vice-Principal Prof. K. Sudhakar Reddy and all the members expressed their deep sense of gratitude and sincere thanks to all the members of the Academic Council for their active participation and suggestions.
